Dream team 2023



The 2023 Ice Hockey World Championship was co-hosted by Finland and Latvia from 12th to 28th May. It was 86th edition of the tournament organized by the International Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF) featuring 16 teams in the top division. The tournament also served as a qualification for the 2024 Winter Olympics, with the top six teams securing their spots in Beijing. The games were played in two venues: the Tampere Deck Arena in Tampere, Finland, and the Arena Riga in Riga, Latvia. The teams were divided into two groups of eight, with the top four teams from each group advancing to the quarterfinals. The quarterfinals were cross-over, with the exception of a possible Finland-Latvia match-up.

In this tournament Canada won beating Germany in the final and taking home gold for the 28th time. But this tournament's biggest surprise was the Latvian team. The tournament for Latvians was like a roller coaster. They lost the first 2 games, then won 5 games and taking 3rd place in the group reached quarterfinals. Where they had to play against Sweden, and everybody thought that it was an easy game for Sweden, but Latvians proved them wrong by winning the game and reaching semi-finals. In semi-finals they had to play against Canada for the second time in this tournament and unfortunately, they lost. So, the final game was against USA for the third place. And that game was when Latvians made history by winning the first medal for Latvia in Ice Hockey World Championship.



All players and coaching staff were amazing and gave everything for this tournament and this win. But a very important player who often saved the team was goalkeeper Arthur Shilov, which won tournament MVP (most valuable player).

But a big part of this win was Latvian fans and just because the games were at home they were crazier than ever. For every game there was a full stadium, there was a fan zone outside and in every household people were cheering. When the decisive games were held in Finland Latvian fans were there. It was like they were playing in home. As the head coach and some players have said: they always had one more player- the fans.

The fans were crazy after the win and for that reason, the parliament of the Republic of Latvia announced the Monday after the historic victory a national holiday. On that day at least 30,000 fans had gathered at the Freedom Monument at the hockey players' welcome event in Riga. For Latvians this bronze medal was like a gold medal, and it showed that we are a hockey country and our fans are the best.

Eurovision 2023

Eurovision is the world's longest-running international TV contest, with over 65 years of history. Around 200 million people across Europe and the world watch it on TV every year. It spreads a global message of unity and acceptance. It allows every participant country to show their unique culture, music, and traditions. It showcases Europe's diversity and inspires new musicians every year.

This year's contest sadly couldn't happen after traditions in last year's winning country Ukraine due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine. It took place in Liverpool, United Kingdom. Thirty-seven countries participated in the contest, with Bulgaria, Montenegro, and North Macedonia ceasing their participation, mainly due to the economic impact of the 2021-2023 global crisis.

The winner was Sweden with the song "Tattoo", performed by Loreen. She made history by being the first woman to win the Eurovision Song Contest twice. There have been a lot of discussions about this year's winner because Finland's singer Kaarja with a funny but catchy song called "Cha, Cha, Cha" and his charismatic personality captured a lot of hearts and even won the viewers' votes. Due to this, many Eurovision fans weren't happy about the outcome. But Kaarja can be the winner of our hearts anyway.





Latvia has participated in the Eurovision Song Contest 23 times, making its debut in the year 2000 when Brainstorm (Prāta Vētra) represented Latvia with the song "My Star" and secured 3rd place. Latvia's first and so far only victory was in the 2002 contest, won by Marie N with the song "I Wanna." The 2003 contest took place in Riga due to the previous year's victory. The show was hosted by two of Latvia's most successful representatives: Marija Naumova and Renārs Kaupers. The third time Latvia reached the top 5 was in the 2005 contest, represented by Valters and Kaža with the song "The War Is Not Over." From 2009 to 2014, Latvia did not qualify for the final. In 2015, after a 7-year hiatus, Latvia qualified for the Eurovision final, represented by Aminata with the song "Love Injected," achieving 6th place in the final. Since 2016 Latvia has not qualified for the finals.

This year our country was presented by the indie pop band "Sudden Lights" by a lullaby called "Aijā". It is an indie-rock track with folk undertones. The title "Aijā" roughly translates to "hushaby" or "shush" in English. According to Sudden Lights, the song is a lullaby to the world, providing comfort through difficult times. They said: "Witnessing the dark events in the world and people's lives ruined by evil, we could not remain indifferent". Despite the high hopes and Latvian fan love for the song, it did not qualify for the final.

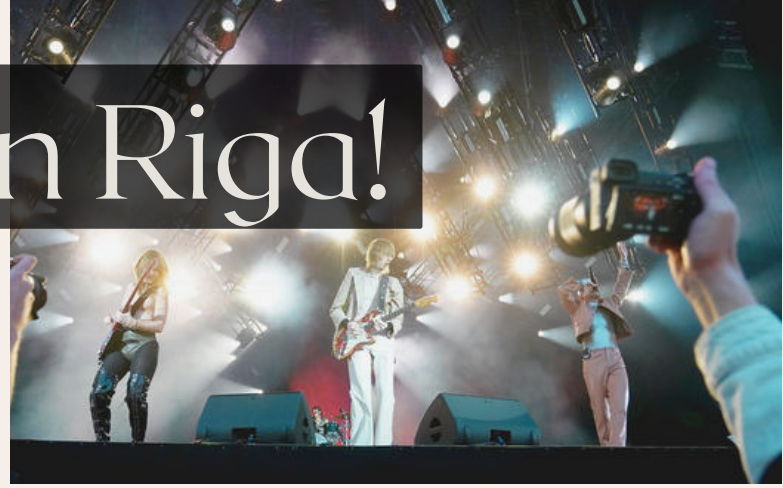
Måneskin in Riga!

To be honest, a lot of Eurovision artists go on tour the next year, so this did not come as a surprise to most, but for a small country like Latvia it did, because they were coming to Riga.



But you may think how did it end up being a world tour? It was rescheduled two times due to COVID-19 and the war in Ukraine. At this time the band only had grown in popularity, so they decided to add dates in America and for some places change arenas to fit more people. I had the opportunity to go to the concert in Riga and it was amazing. The concert took place on May 18th in one of the biggest outside stadiums in Latvia “Mežaparka strāde” which has a capacity of 50000. The venue for this show was also changed, mostly because the original arena was occupied by the 2023 IIHF World Championship. I decided to go only a month before the show, so I was happy about the venue change because it is bigger, so I was still able to buy tickets. I am happy that I went, and I have to say they are great performers, and it is one of the best concerts I have been to.

An upgrade to our school's lounge

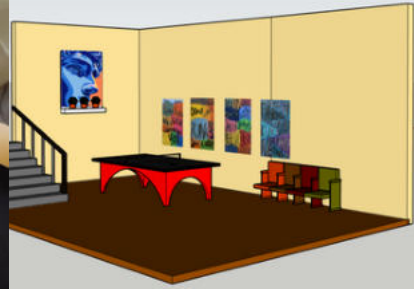
In the subject, design and technology, our class (grade 11) were thinking of ways of how to improve our schools lounge

Latvia's history May 4th of 1990

November 18, 1918, and May 4, 1990, are the two most important dates in history of Latvia. This year marks 33 years since May 4, 1990, when the Supreme Council with the votes of 138 deputies accepted the declaration "On the restoration of the independence of the of Latvia". Since April 9, 2002, this day was designated as a public holiday. This celebration is one the newest Latvian holidays. Tens of thousands of people gathered in the centre of Riga near the building of the Supreme Council, where the Republic of Latvia is located now. On that day fate of Latvia was decided- for the first time after the beginning of the Soviet occupation, the elected Latvian parliament decide on the adaption of the declaration of independence of the country.



Many of people, who were standing outside, listened to the Supreme Council meeting on the radios, counting the votes for the country's independence during the voting. The Declaration of Independence on May 4, 1990, can be compared to the country's second birthday- it was undoubtedly an important moment in the life of our country. This event has not yet fully evaluated and there is still much to study about the requirements of accepting the Declaration of Independence today.

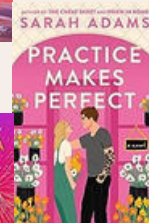
