

This year, our collective also dressed up in masks. We prepared horns, and clothes and prepared a performance.

We went to this festival on the second day. In the first part of the day, we went to different houses, where for 30 minutes we danced, sang, and wished the farmers a good harvest by performing various rituals. Owners treated us with snacks and their special drinks, which warmed us in the cold weather.

During the evening, we mostly rested and watched the opening performances of the festival. Then it was our time to perform. We had to wait quite a long time for our performance as we were one of the last. The performance lasted a few minutes, during which we demonstrated the traditions of Piebalga. We danced, taught children to read, told old beliefs, and in the end, we also scattered ashes. Right after our performance, we went home, because it was a very tiring day, and we didn't stay for the party.





This festival will remain in my memory, because I experienced something like this for the first time. It was a very spontaneous idea to apply for this and at that moment I didn't even really know what I was singing up for. I remember the first time I went to the rehearsal; I was very confused. There were people already making costumes and they were so into it that I was a little bit scared. When it comes to the festival itself, I have a bit of mixed feelings, because I liked the first part of the day, where we walked house to house, but then there was a long wait, which was tiring.

I really liked our own performance because it was different and interesting. I also liked that the band "Dzilna", who was with us all day, was part of our performance. They played live music which made the whole performance livelier. I have always heard stories about kekatnieki, in various Latvian beliefs and stories. But experiencing it is something else and sharing this feeling with others is impossible.

Student scholarship

VITO LU FODS

The Vītola Foundation was founded on April 4, 2002, to help capable, diligent, and underprivileged young people to study in a Latvian university. It was founded by Vilis and Marta Vītoli.

Every year between February 1st and March 1st, 12th grade students apply to it, hoping to receive a scholarship. This year I also applied. To apply you must meet at least one of the criteria: good learning outcomes (average mark 7.5 or above), difficult social and material conditions, being an orphan, being raised by one parent, living in a family with 3 or more children, success in contests.

To apply for a scholarship, you must fill out a form. The fund council meeting examines the applications and selects the candidates, they are interviewed, and after that, the fund council meeting decides on granting the scholarship. Rejected candidates receive a rejection letter, the others remain on the list of candidates for one academic year.

I think this is a great opportunity for young people. Of course, working for this form takes time, but if you get this scholarship, it pays off. As a student from a small town, this would help me settle into a new environment, so I hope that I will get this scholarship.

One of the most popular winter sports is biathlon. In the annual competitions every year Latvia is also represented. It must be admitted that often without any big success. But this year Latvia got a place on the podium.

At the world championship in the Czech Republic, Andrejs Rastorgujevs won a silver medal in the 15-kilometer mass start. With perfect accuracy in shooting and the 6th fastest step in the distance, he set a great result. The winner was Norwegian biathlonist Johannes Thingnes Bø, who finished the race in 34 minutes and 50.2 seconds. Andrejs Rastorgujevs was just 15.1 seconds behind.

Before now, Rastorgujev's highest achievement in the mass start was last year when he finished fifth. This is his first World Championship medal, which is at the same time the highest achievement in Latvian biathlon history. Moreover, it is the first medal for Latvia in 19 years, since the last time Ilmārs Bricis stepped on the third step of the World Championship

podium, which was in 2005.

SUPERNOVA

Supernova is the Latvian national selection for the international song contest "Eurovision". It is created by the Latvian television channel LTV1. This year the jury picked 15 best songs from 108 songs. A few weeks before the event all of the contestants and their songs that got picked are made public. In the semi-final, all contestants perform their songs and the audience votes for their favourite. A week later in the final show, we find out the winner who represents us in Eurovision that year. The winner is chosen only by the audience votes. In the end, the winner performs in Eurovision.

This year the winner of Supernova was known almost instantly as the participants were made public. Most of the artists that participated were new musicians or had bad songs. The only one that sounded like a Eurovision-worthy entry was the song "Hollow" performed by Dons. He is very popular in Latvia.

This year we had really exciting guest performances. In the semifinal, Alika from our neighbour country Estonia performed. She represented Estonia last year in Eurovision. For finals, we had a really special guest Eurovision star Duncan Laurence who sang "Arcade" and won in Eurovision 2019. I hope we do well in this year's Eurovision.


She did everything from the heart, with passion. A wonderful, bright, sincere person. Her sparkling joy rubbed off on everyone around her. She will be dearly
